rtists' books take many forms - fromhandmade and lusciously tactile to linear and informative, abstract and questioning to sculptural and monumental. Artists' books can be a delight to the eye, a pleasure to the hand, and made tangible in forms that introduce us not only to new interpretations of an ancient concept but also to questions and ideas on 21st century form and format.

Artists who observe this world and interpret the idea of the book are invited to submit entries to the Decatur Arts Alliance's inaugural juried exhibition visually celebrating the book form.

The exhibition, July 19-Sept. 20 in the gallery at The Art Institute of Atlanta-Decatur, will be held in conjunction with the AJC Decatur Book Festival, the largest independent book festival in the country. It is expected to draw 75,000 book-lovers to downtown Decatur over Labor Day weekend (Aug.30-Sept.1), demonstrating that books are cherished by multitudes in tangible and touchable form even as they morph into new forms and formats.

# jurors

Brian Dettmer has had solo shows in New York, Chicago, San Francisco, Atlanta, and Barcelona. His work has been exhibited throughout North America and Europe at galleries and museums including the Museum of Arts and Design in New York, the Museum of Contemporary Art-Georgia, the International Museum of Surgical Science in Chicago, and the Museum Rijswijh in the Netherlands. Dettmer's work has been covered in The New York Times, ArtNews, The Guardian, Telegraph, Chicago Tribune, Modern Painters, Wired, The Village Voice and on NPR.

Jerushia Graham is Artist-in-Studio with The Creatives Project and an instructor for The Art Institute of Atlanta-Decatur. She has taught printmaking and book arts at Kennesaw State University, the University of Georgia, the African American Museum and The Fabric Workshop in Philadelphia, the Rosenbach Museum, the Spelman College Fine Art Museum, and The Dream Community in Taiwan. She earned a BFA in printmaking and fabric design from UGA and an MFA in book arts/ printmaking from the University of the Arts in Philadelphia.

Beck Whitehead is Chair of Papermaking and Book Arts at the Southwest School of Art in San Antonio, and has taught workshops in papermaking around the country and in Canada. Whitehead creates paper paintings and one-of-a-kind books. She earned an MFA from the University of Texas at San Antonio and a BA from Trinity University. Exhibitions include the Center for Book and Paper Arts in Chicago and the Robert C. Williams American Museum of Papermaking in Atlanta. She is coproducer of the documentary, Pulp Painting Symposium 2010.

# how to enter

Entries for *The Book as Art* must be submitted digitally through www.callforentry.org. (CaFÉ)

If you have not registered previously with CaFÉ, setting up your portfolio is free of charge. There is a \$25 charge for entering up to three items in this exhibition, with up to five images per item. After completing the entry information a credit card number will be required to confirm the entry process.

CaFÉ requires that all images conform to a specific format. The DAA encourages entrants to review the instructions and tutorials for formatting images and entering before beginning the actual entry process.

Entries will be active on the CaFÉ website March 25-June 3, and all entries must be completed by midnight MST on June 3.

Please retain a copy of the information you provide on the entry form. Notification of acceptance will be made via email no later than Monday, July 1.

Participants may enter up to three pieces for one fee. Submissions will include the following:

- Contact information including mailing address, telephone number, email address, and website address (if applicable)
- · Title of each work submitted
- Brief statement about the work. This may include descriptive material. Limit to 75 words.
- Up to five images of each work submitted for jurying. If the work is in standard book format it must include an image of the book closed and one of the book opened. If applicable, it should include an image of how the work is presented. Other detailed images are optional, but all submitted images must be formatted to the specifications outlined on the CaFÉ website (www.callforentry.org/image\_prep. phtml#resources).\*
- Information on size of the edition (i.e., whether this is a one-of-a-kind piece or one of a limited edition)
- Image list numbered to correspond to the portfolio images submitted. Please include full photography credits as well as title, dimensions, and description of each work.
- Presentation/installation requirements for the work submitted including any special fixtures required.

### Notification and Return of Entries

Notification of acceptance will be made by email only, no later than July 1. Instructions for shipment and retrieval of artwork will follow. Applicants not chosen will also be notified. No phone calls, please.

Images of accepted work will be retained by the DAA for archival purposes. The exhibition will hang from July 19 through September 20 in the Gallery of The Art Institute of Atlanta-Decatur, Decatur, Georgia.

Sales are encouraged. The DAA handles all sales and collects a 25% commission on all artwork sold as a result of this exhibition. All artwork for sale must be priced by the artist and so stated in the online entry. Please be sure to include the 25% commission for the DAA in your price. The 7% Georgia sales tax will be added at the point of sale.

### agreement

Submitting an entry form to this exhibition through Call for Entries (www.café.org) constitutes an agreement on the part of the artist with all conditions set forth in this prospectus. No work accepted for the exhibition may be withdrawn before the close of the exhibition. After acceptance, the artist cannot substitute another work for the accepted one or raise the sales price.

The Decatur Arts Alliance and The Art Institute of Atlanta-Decatur reserve the right to refuse to install any work that, upon arrival at the AIA-Decatur Gallery, differs markedly from the images submitted or that does not, for any reason, meet the exhibitions standards of excellence.

# eligibility

Artists are invited to enter original or limited edition original or altered books. Participating items will be selected from submitted entries by a panel of three jurors on the basis of creative excellence and quality of execution. All works must be the work of the entering artist. Collaborative projects are eligible.
