



## The Book as Art 3.0: No Jacket Required

July 24 through Sept. 18 • An event of the 2015 AJC Decatur Book Festival

Presented by the Decatur Arts Alliance and The Art Institute of Atlanta-Decatur

The third edition of the juried exhibition, The Book As Art, returns to downtown Decatur July 24 through Sept. 18. The exhibition, an innovative visual component of the AJC Decatur Book Festival, begins with a gala opening on Thursday, September 3, 2015, sponsored by the Decatur Arts Alliance (DAA), in conjunction with the gallery at The Art Institute of Atlanta-Decatur.

V. 3.0 of *The Book as Art* again will emphasize the art form that can be a delight to the eye, a pleasure to the hand, and made tangible in forms that introduce us to new interpretations of an ancient concept as well as questions and ideas on 21<sup>st</sup> –century form and format. This is an exhibition that has been described by critics at ArtsAtTL.com and Burnaway.org as, "wildly eclectic" and finding ". . . new and often startling ways to reimagine not just the physical format of a book but also the ideological essence of the content." Approaching "sheer aesthetic magic" and with examples that ". . .push boundaries and challenge expectations in ways that are both startling and exhilarating."

The Art Institute of Atlanta-Decatur gallery, in downtown Decatur in the heart of the festival, is ideally accessible to the 85,000 festival attendees. The festival's popularity testifies to the fact that books are cherished by multitudes in tangible and touchable form even as they morph into new forms and formats.

The Jurors:

Margot Ecke is the owner of Smokey Road Press, a letterpress and binding studio in Athens, Georgia. She received her MFA from the Rhode Island School of Design and her BFA from Cornell University. She received a professional printing certificate from the Tamarind Institute at the University of New Mexico and completed her training by earning her diploma in bookbinding at the North Bennett Street School in Boston. Ecke was the Victor Hammer Fellow in the Book Arts at Wells College in Aurora, New York from 2004-2006, where she interned at the press and letterfoundry of Michael and Winifred Bixler. She has taught workshops at the Penland School of Crafts, the Atlanta Printmakers Studio, the North Bennet Street School and the Ink Shop. She was an assistant professor of book arts and printmaking at the University of Georgia from 2006–2009. Her work is exhibited both nationally and internationally.

Arlyn Ende has for five decades curated exhibitions, created fiber artworks, and designed and edited books of her own and for other artists in New York, New Orleans, and in Sewanee, Tennessee, where she currently maintains a studio. Her commissioned textiles are found in public and private permanent collections across the United States, and her fiber collages are exhibited internationally. In 2006, during Ende's tenure as director of the University of the South Art Gallery, she organized and co-curated with Wellesley College's Ruth R. Rogers the *Beyond Words* exhibition and colloquium in Sewanee. This

ground-breaking juried exhibition of artists' books by American, Canadian, British and Russian artists introduced the scope and vitality of the genre to enthusiastic audiences region-wide. Purchase awards from *Beyond Words* established a growing collection of contemporary handmade artists' books in the Jessie Ball DuPont Library and Archives at the University of the South.

Jeff Rathermel received an MFA in printmaking, hand papermaking, and book arts from the University of Minnesota in 2000, and a BFA in printmaking with a minor in art history from the University of Minnesota in 1997. His work has been shown in numerous exhibitions across the country, including Metaphor Taking Shape: Poetry, Art and the Book at Yale University; Jeff Rathermel: Recent and Revisited at Carleton College; Road Trip: A Minnesota/Oregon Book Arts Exchange at Lane College in Eugene, Oregon; and Action/Interaction: Book/Arts at Columbia College Center for Book and Paper Arts in Chicago. His work is included in many public collections, including Yale University, University of Chicago, University of Iowa, Minnesota Historical Society, Minnesota Museum of American Art, and Walker Art Center. He has served as affiliate and adjunct faculty at the College of Visual Arts, the University of Minnesota Department of Art, Carleton College Department of Art, and the Minneapolis College of Art and Design. A recognized artist and expert on book arts, Rathermel also serves as Executive Director of the Minnesota Center for Book Arts.
